Sean Lynch's *The Use and Abuse of Monuments* considers the traditional monument as a site of empowered remembrance or imagined collective expression, the modern sculpture as a signifier of the physicality of space and urbanity, and the contemporary art installation as a shifting social and discursive entity often reactive to audience and context. Beyond the conventions of spectatorship proposed in these definitions, what is determined by daily treatment and active public participation? Research on this topic is collected here, with fieldwork around Dublin City where attitudes existing between action and commentary, creation and decay, serenity and disruption are apparent.

Published to coincide with Sean Lynch's *Me Jewel & Darlin'*, a public art commission for O'Connell Street in Dublin in 2011.
